## Golfers tee off next week

The tournament produces more than half of the revenue the club needs annually to fund community and charity needs.



Chairman **Joel Langston** has forms available for all reasons—registration, sponsorships, donations, etc—and hopes club members will step up to support the tournament. Tax-free declaration forms are also available.

Tee off time for the tournament is 11 a.m. The cost is \$95 per person, or a special price of \$385 for a team and hole sponsorship.

## Club to vote today on Foundation procedures

The Board of Directors will submit recommendations adopted at its April 21 meeting regarding organizational procedures for the Wentzville Rotary Foundation. These recommendations were brought to the Board by **David Agne**:

1. The Foundation will maintain its checking account in a separate bank from that of the regular club account.
2. The Foundation will have a different treasurer from that of the Rotary Club.
3. The Foundation will have a different Post Office Box.
4. All fund-raisers are to be operated through the Rotary Foundation and all donations by the club to 5013C entities (other than donations from perfect

attendance wheel spins) be made by the Foundation. (Thus, checks made out for fund-raisers will be made out to the Wentzville Rotary Foundation).

5. The Wentzville Rotary Foundation will elect its own officers. They can be (or not be) the same officers as the club, other than the treasurer.
6. The club will issue a check to the Wentzville Rotary Foundation for \$10,000 so that the bank account can be opened and the Foundation will have operating funds.
7. Tax receipts will be issued to donors of cash or of items to the Foundation. The Foundation will not place a value on non-cash donations.
